




How the Bank Works Funds flow diagram: Tuition



Center for Clinical & Translational Science

- Founded in 2009 \$20M NIH Clinical and Translational Science Award
- Breaks down geographic, administrative, technical boundaries to create communities of researchers around health problems
- Provides service, funding, education and training opportunities
- Six health sciences colleges, regional sites and external partners
- Five research/service cores: Design and Analysis, Clinical Interface, Biomedical Informatics, Regulatory Support, Advocacy and Community Engagement.
- Served 510+ individuals; been cited in 39 publications; contributed to 2 patents
- Awarded \$1.5 M in pilot grants across 27 departments, 9 colleges and one community organization
- Implemented REDCap web app to build and manage online surveys and databases -- currently 268 users
- \$429 K equipment support for the RRC in the past year


